## 9 COUNCILLORS ISSUES AND AGENDA ITEMS FOR NEXT MEETING - CONCERNING PLANNING & ENVIRONMENT ONLY

Councillor Dr D R Bard explained about Barclays bank closing in Sawston and thought a letter should be written to Barclays to explain that the Parish Council was not very happy about this and what impact it will have on the village.

The Council is deeply concerned that this decision has been taken without any consultation with the Bank's customers, the Parish Council, District and County councillors or the wider public. The Bank did not even see fit to inform the Parish Council or Local representatives once the decision had been taken, leaving the news to spread by word of mouth. The way in which this episode has been handled shows a total contempt for the local community.

Sawston is the largest village in South Cambridgeshire and is listed in the emerging Local Plan as a major rural centre. It has been identified for expansion by 540 dwellings in the Local Plan and has recently been listed amongst the 30 best places to live in the countryside (The Times, 25/03/2014). The closure of this, the last bank in the village, will create real problems for small retailers who are unable to obtain cash on business accounts from the Post Office. A number of small retailers in Sawston are already under pressure and the absence of a bank in the village is therefore likely to have a significant adverse effect on the viability of the High Street. The closure will also discriminate against elderly and disabled residents of the village who do not use the internet and may not be able to travel to other banks.

Councillor Dr D R Bard also has concerns about the new traffic lights on the bypass. When you are using the pedestrian/cycle crossing on the bypass you do not travel straight across but have to wait in the centre for the lights to change. The concern is children may think it is safe to cross as you do with most crossings travel to the other side of the road. Clerk to ask for the CCC to meet to discuss Parish Council concerns.

Also the Sawston sign just before the slip road into Sawston from Stapleford has still not been cleared which the Parish Council has asked that this sign is kept visible. Clerk to chase.
